## Definitions for Quiz in ENGL 340

## Question forms: thee questions: 1. Define the following five; 2. Provide the technical term for the following three definitions; and 3. Provide an example of the following

- 1. **traditional grammar:** the description of the structure of phrases and sentences based on established categories used in the analysis of Latin and Greek
- 2. **prescriptive approach:** an approach to grammar that has rules for the proper use of the language, traditionally based on Latin
- 3. **descriptive approach:** an approach to grammar that is based on a description of the structures actually used in a language, not what should be used, in contrast to the prescriptive approach
- 4. **constituent analysis:** a grammatical analysis of how small constituents (or components) go together to form larger constituents in sentences
- 5. **structural ambiguity:** a situation in which a single phrase or sentence has two (or more) different underlying structures and interpretations
- 6. structural analysis: the investigation of the distribution of grammatical forms in a language
- 7. generative grammar: a set of rules defining the possible sentences in a language
- 8. **complementiser (C):** a word such as *that* introducing a complement phrase (as in I heard that she is late.)
- 9. **complement phrase (CP):** a structure such as that Mary helped George used to complete a construction beginning with a structure such as Cathy knew
- 10. syntax (syntactic structures): (the analysis of) the structure of phrases and sentences
- 11. noun (N): a word such as boy, bicycle or freedom used to describe a person, thing or idea
- 12. **noun phrase (NP):** a phrase such as the boy or an old bicycle, containing a noun plus other constituents

- 13. verb (V): a word such as go, drown or know used to describe an action, event or state
- 14. verb phrase (VP): a phrase such as saw a dog, containing a verb and other constituents
- 15. preposition (Prep): a word such as in or with used with a noun phrase
- 16. **preposition phrase (PP):** a phrase such as with a dog, consisting of a preposition plus a noun phrase
- 17. tree diagram: a diagram with branches showing the hierarchical organization of structures
